Resident Spotlight: Alexandria Medina

In February of 2021, Alexandria Medina moved to Legacy from Jersey City, NJ. Born in the Dominican Republic on July 2, 1939, Alexandria is the oldest daughter of Lucia Rodriguez and Pedro De Leon. When she was around 19 years old, she moved to Yonkers, NY with her brother, Angel. They had a friend who owned a small company where they could both work. Through the years Alexandria also worked as a housekeeper, and was able to use her sewing talents as a seamstress.

It was in New York that she met her future husband, David Medina. They both rented an apartment in the same complex. They married on August 15, 1965. They raised Lucy and David in the Bronx, NY. Alexandria recalls spending as much time as possible with her children. They loved to be outside together. One of her favorite memories was when she was able to go with her daughter to Europe.

Alexandria, and her family, lived near Yankee Stadium. One day, she passed by the stadium when a convention was taking place. She approached a brother standing outside and asked him if it was too late to be saved.

He kindly reassured her that there was still time. Alexandria began to study the Bible and was baptized on April 9, 1983. Serving Jehovah is a blessing that Alexandria continues to treasure. When reminiscing about her life in Jehovah's service, she spoke of a Bible student she struggled to help progress. This student would even hide from Alexandria, when she came to visit. In Memory: Angeline Carrozza 9/21/29-8/31/21

Angeline "Angie" Carrozza was born on September 21, 1929 to John and Rose (Pizzola) Labrasca. She

was the younger sister of Russell Labrasca. The family endured tragedy when John died as a result of a car accident. Russell was only 2 years old and Angie was just 3 months old.

Years later, Rose learned the truth and shared it with Angie. Angie dedicated her life to Jehovah on January 7, 1956. She had the privilege of pioneering for over 20 years. Angie and her husband, Anthony Carrozza Sr., helped over 40 people come to know Jehovah. Together they assisted in 7 different congregations and were instrumental in establishing the Spanish language field in Lancaster, PA.

Angie and her brother Russell, were so close that they were both married in a Roman Catholic double wedding on June 18, 1949. She always desired for her brother to share in her love of Jehovah. 50 years after Angie's baptism, Russell also became one of Jehovah's Witnesses.

In addition to the great joy the Carrozzas found in serving Jehovah together, they also enjoyed the great privilege of raising three children; Diane Fritz, Judy McMichael (deceased 8/2010), and Anthony Carrozza Jr. They were also the proud grandparents of 10 grandchildren and 2 great-grandsons. Anthony and Angie enjoyed 67 years of marriage, until his death in 2017.

When asked to share memories of her mom, Angie's daughter Diane said, "My mother loved ice cream, dancing with Dad, and anything related to her worship of Jehovah, the ministry, and especially attending conventions." In the time she spent with us at Legacy Place, we could clearly see how strong her love of Jehovah was. We know He treasured her years of faithful service and now holds her safely in his memory. In Memory: Lois Morgan 3/18/34-9/28/21


Lois Morgan was born on March 18, 1934 to William and Beulah Nagle. She had an older brother, Bill, and a younger brother, Clark.

They would stop and examine pinecones and discuss what they could learn about Jehovah from his creation. Her daughters said she was a wonderfully devoted wife and a diligent Bible student. They remember Lois always did all her studying balanced at the bottom of her bed. She could sit there for hours studying. She enjoyed playing games and adding a coordinating set of beads to every one of our outfits. Even as dementia presented itself, Lois continued to demonstrate the ability to not take herself too seriously, often laughing at her mistakes. The ever present twinkle in her eye accompanied her smile. We will greatly miss that smile, but look forward to seeing it again in a better world soon to come!


